

Dawson, Richard Cecil (1865 - 1955)

Description:

Richard Dawson was born in Ireland and came to train at Whatcombe, near Lambourn, bringing with him the steeplechaser Drogheda who won the Grand National the following year. He was the private trainer for the newspaper magnate Sir Edward Hulton in Newmarket for a few years, after which he returned to Whatcombe and trained for the Aga Khan III for eight seasons. Richard Dawson was the leading trainer in 1916, 1924 and 1929.
